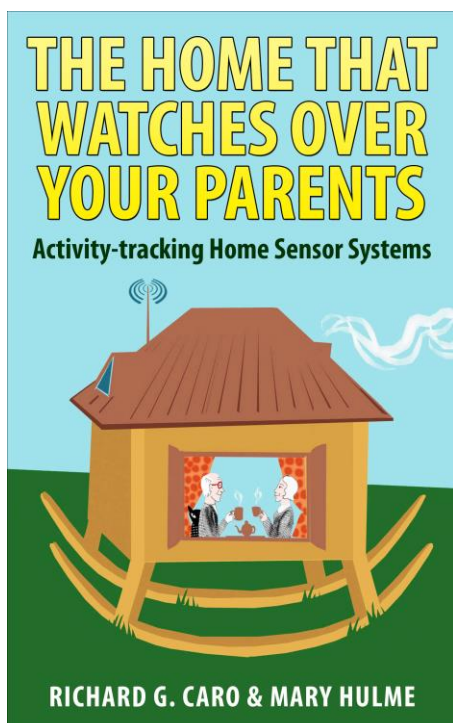


Activity-tracking Home Sensors: New Technology to Keep Aging Parents Safe
